

Bus Drivers' Corner

COLD WEATHER

All students riding on school buses must wear, which is preferable, or carry with them, proper clothing appropriate for the weather conditions. If a student is not wearing, or does not have in their possession, appropriate clothing suitable for the weather conditions, the bus driver shall advise the parent, principal and document the discussion. In a situation that the Principal determines to be of significant risk to the student, he/she may decide to keep the student at the school until they have appropriate clothing or the parent picks them up.

Process Regarding Bus Cancellation

Student safety is the primary concern of the Valhalla School Foundation (VSF). Everyone involved with student transportation at Valhalla recognizes this responsibility and works to ensure the safe transportation of all Valhalla Community School (VCS) students year round. As you know, winter in Northwestern Alberta can bring inclement and extreme weather conditions. Severe cold, icy and snowy road conditions and reduced visibility all present challenges to transporting students in winter.

While the Valhalla administration recognizes the importance of getting students to school for their instructional time, the decision to cancel buses is not made lightly. A great deal of thought and energy is involved in this process; our primary concern is always student safety.

Valhalla School Foundation board policy states that operation of school buses will be suspended on the days when the temperature is equal to, or colder than -40 C. As we all know, temperatures can vary several degrees within just a small area. Currently, temperature readings are taken from the Transportation Director's (TD) home and the AMA camera 43-02, which is on highway 43 east of junction 723. This AMA site is the same site Peace Wapiti School Division (PWSD) uses to determine bus cancellation for their Beaverlodge school area, which encompasses the Valhalla, Hythe, Elmworth and Wembley areas.

On days when road conditions are a concern, the TD will drive parts of all four VCS bus routes. This begins between 4:30 and 5:00 am. The TD may discuss conditions with the VCS bus drivers, other knowledgeable individuals in the area, and/or the County of GP foreman for our area. Between 6:00am and 6:30am, the TD will call the VCS superintendent to inform and discuss conditions in the area and a decision will be made whether to run buses or cancel buses for that day. Once a decision has been reached to cancel buses, the TD informs all VCS bus drivers, the school principal, the radio stations, and the VCS webmaster of the bus cancellation. Every effort is made to have bus cancellations announced by 7:00 am.

We are a separate school jurisdiction from PWSD. The decision for PWSD to suspend their buses is their responsibility. The decision to suspend the VCS buses is the responsibility of the Superintendent of VCS and its Transportation Director.

Finally and most importantly, the VSF leaves the decision of bus ridership to its parents. If parents have concerns about their area of a bus route, they have the right to decide not to place their child on the bus. As always, we ask parents to please let your driver or TD know if your child will not be on the bus. This helps make your driver aware of possible changing road conditions in your area and changes in their bus route.

Our goal is to provide a safe and reliable transportation service to support our parents in getting their children to school. Thank you for your partnership in making our school's transportation as safe and efficient as possible.

Parent & family volunteers are an integral part of VCS. Everyone volunteering at the VCS must have a current signed volunteer application. Volunteers that work directly with students require a criminal records check and an agreement form.

- motivate children to work and help them succeed in school.
- graciously accept direction and constructive criticism from staff members for which they are volunteering.
- acknowledge the teacher as the authority in the classroom.
- NOT confront a teacher regarding disagreements or differences of opinion in the presence of children.
- be respectful of the classroom by not disrupting a teacher's instructional time or student learning.
- Dress modestly and appropriately for a school environment (i.e. midriff covered, no short shorts/skirts, no spaghetti straps).
- Wear a current volunteer nametag at all times when volunteering at the school
- sign in and out at the front office when volunteering at the school.
- record all VCS volunteer hours, including those worked outside of school, on the log sheet in the front
 office.
- Ensure that all children (e.g. younger siblings, non-students) accompanying the volunteer on school premises are supervised at all times and must not be disrupting school activities.
- arrange for a replacement in the event the volunteer cannot meet their scheduled obligations
- call the school (780-356-2730) 24 hours in advance and inform appropriate staff of any volunteer replacements via voice mail.

VOLUNTEER ACTIVIES

Grounds And Beautification - This group will is responsible for bringing some life into the school grounds by planting and maintaining bushes, trees, and flowers

Classroom Volunteer - Volunteer assists a teacher on a weekly basis. Activities include helping students one to one or in a small group, preparing instructional materials, or helping the teacher with other tasks

Helping Hands - Volunteer responsibilities include typing, photocopying, laminating and preparing materials for use in the classroom or with projects

After School Sports -

Recycling – taking contents of recycling to recycle bins

Trades - Are you a tradesperson willing to offer your expertise?

School Council – is the voice of the parents and students within the school community. Meetings are monthly and parent are encouraged to come to the informal meeting. It's a great way to meet other parents, voice ideas and concerns and connect to the school community. Child care is provided during meeting.

Truck – do you own a truck, which could be used for general hauling (pulling water tank trailer for watering trees)

Hot Lunch – every second Friday is VCS hot lunch program. Organizing orders & food prior to and on the Friday helping to hand out lunch to the classrooms.

Home based volunteering – typing, costumes, baking, telephone calls,

Chaperone – field trips, swimming lessons, school events (playday, parties)

On call- volunteer as needed – Teri Fox Run, Christmas Concert etc

Ski Hill – Each family is asked to adopt a day for management and running of the ski hill. This is a major fundraiser for the school community. Training is supplied and it's a great way to spend the day as a family while contributing to the school community. The ski hill generally operates from January to April depending on snow conditions. Open every weekend and holidays from 10-4. Positions include 2 kitchen staff, 2 rental volunteers and 2 T bar lift volunteers for a minimum of 6 weeks. **Donations** – for fundraising and to contribute to the school community. Our grade 7/8 class would once again like to bring Christmas to these children.

We will be making snack packs (candy bags) to sell on Halloween.
